Eligibility is a site-by-site determination. The health care provider has to be public or non-profit, and in one of these categories:

(1) post-secondary educational institutions offering health care instruction, teaching hospitals, and medical schools; (2) community health centers or health centers providing health care to migrants; (3) local health departments or agencies; (4) community mental health centers; (5) not-for-profit hospitals; (6) rural health clinics; (7) skilled nursing facilities; or (8) consortia of health care providers consisting of one or more entities falling into the first seven categories.

An interested entity has to submit an FCC Form 460 to USAC to determine eligibility (information is in the FAQs). Sites that currently participate in RHC have a 460 on file and do not need to do it again.
